



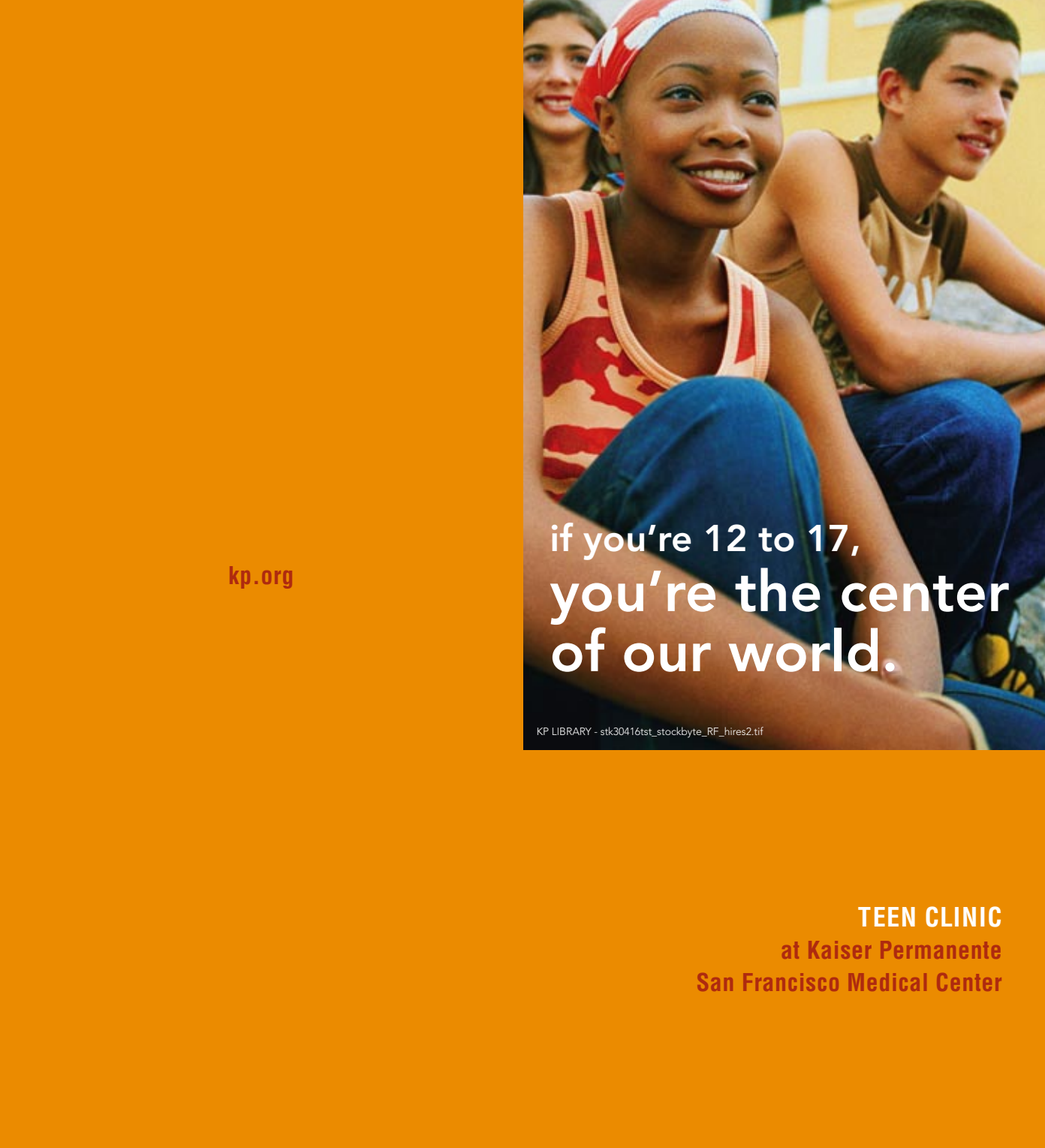

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What is the Teen Clinic?

The Teen Clinic is a place designed for you. Our staff is made up of doctors and nurses who like working with teens and young adults more than any other age group. We're here to listen to you, answer your questions, and help with your concerns.

We encourage you to talk with your parents or guardian about your health and any big decisions you're thinking about, but we do offer some services that you can come in for on your own. What services do you provide?

Come visit us for:

- General physical exams for school, college, camp, or work
- Sports physicals
- Screenings and treatment for minor illnesses
- Counseling for personal and family issues
- Alcohol and drug counseling
- Birth control
- Pregnancy testing, counseling, and emergency contraception (also called the "morning-after pill")
- Sexually transmitted disease (STD) testing and treatment
- Health information and classes (some classes may require a fee)
- Immunizations

How do I make an appointment?
Call (415) 833-8336, Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Have your medical record number handy and we'll help you set up a time. If you prefer the Web, you can schedule your appointment online at kp.org. (To book an appointment online, you'll first need to register on our Web site. We'll mail a password to your home in three to seven days.)



How do I get to the clinic?
We're located at **2200 O'Farrell St. at St. Joseph's Avenue** on the fifth floor. Both the 38 Geary and the 24 Divisadero buses stop very close to the clinic. Below is a list of San Francisco schools and corresponding bus lines that will bring you to the Teen Clinic. Transfer points are also listed.

What are your hours?

You can come in Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Do my parents or guardian need to come with me to my appointments?

This is your space and we want you to feel comfortable here. If you're under 18 and need shots or immunizations, you'll need consent for treatment from a parent or guardian. We encourage you to talk to your parents or guardian if you have a concern about an STD, pregnancy, or contraception, but if you're 12 to 17 years old, you may come by yourself for those services without a parent's or guardian's consent.

Will you tell my parents or guardian when I schedule an appointment?

In some cases, such as when you make an appointment for services related to treatment of an STD, pregnancy, or contraception, we won't contact your parent or guardian without

your permission. You'll need parental consent in order to receive medical services such as immunizations or sports physicals.

Do I have a choice of which doctor I see?

Yes. We realize that some people may feel more comfortable talking to a male doctor, and others to a female doctor. Just let us know what you prefer when you make your appointment and we'll do our best to meet your needs.

What happens when I visit the Teen Clinic?

You'll register in the reception area on the first floor of the 2200 O'Farrell St. medical office building. Once you've registered, you'll be directed to the Teen Clinic on the fifth floor. A nurse or medical assistant will call you from the Teen Clinic waiting area to talk about your medical history, your current concerns, and the reason for your visit. He or she will also record your height,

weight, and blood pressure. The doctor will see you next. Depending on your needs, he or she may give you a complete physical exam or pelvic exam and provide counseling, lab tests, and prescriptions. We can set up your follow-up appointments and give you any referrals you might need before you leave.

What if I need birth control?

Birth control is part of what we call "family planning." One of our providers can discuss birth control options with you and help you decide what's right for you. All of our family planning services are confidential. We won't tell your parents or guardian about your visit or birth control decision, and we won't mail any information to your home.

How long will my appointment last?

Your first visit will probably take about half an hour. Follow-up visits usually take 15 to 30 minutes. They may include lab work, nurse consultations, or video screenings.
