- Engage in content development, literature reviews, data analysis, and/or user testing with clinical experts and patients.
- Develop recommendations and present findings on priority issues in health promotion or population care that impact California's diverse communities.
- Understand the clinical and operational impact of their work through medical center and call center site visits and partnerships with physician leaders.
